Mood and Anxiety Disorders During and After Pregnancy: Assessment and Treatment

### **About the Program:**

This program qualifies for 3.0 continuing education credits.

In this 3 hour training, we will cover the assessment and treatment of Perinatal Mood and Anxiety Disorders (PMADs). It is estimated that 1 in 7 new mothers will suffer from Postpartum Depression and up to 1 in 5 will struggle with Postpartum Anxiety. Given these statistics, it is essential that clinicians who treat women of reproductive age, have a recognition of, and competency in, PMADs. Attendees will be able to understand and differentiate between the "Baby Blues." Postpartum Depression, Postpartum Anxiety and OCD, and Postpartum Psychosis. Risk factors will be discussed including biological, environmental and personal factors. We will also report on the consequences of untreated PMADs. In the treatment section of the presentation, we will cover use of medication during pregnancy and lactation, providing attendees with an understanding of the research supporting the current recommendations. We will also dispel myths around the safety of psychiatric medication use during pregnancy. Lastly, we will cover the psychotherapy models that are empirically supported for the treatment of PMADs as well as other essential self-care strategies.

### Participants will be able to:

- 1. Describe and differentiate between the "Baby Blues," Postpartum Anxiety and OCD, and Postpartum Psychosis.
- Discuss the risk factors for developing perinatal mental health issues including the consequences of untreated PMADs.
- Summarize the research supporting the use of medications for PMADs as well as psychotherapy interventions.

### **About the Presenters:**

Michelle Wiersgalla, M.D., is a psychiatrist at Park Nicollet. She attended the University of Wisconsin Medical School in Madison and did her residency in psychiatry at the Harvard Longwood Program in Boston. She works as a psychopharmacology consultant to the Park Nicollet Women's Reproductive Mental Health Program and was previously a staff psychiatrist for the Hennepin County Medical Center Women's Mental Health Program. She sees general adult psychiatry patients as well as patients who are pregnant, planning pregnancy, or postpartum.

Gabrielle Mauren, Ph.D., LP, is a psychologist and the Clinical Manager for the adult psychotherapy practice at Park Nicollet Health Services. She earned her Master's and Ph.D. in counseling psychology from the University of Minnesota. She completed her pre-doctoral internship and post-doctoral fellowship at the University of Pennsylvania. She has worked in higher education and community mental health with patients from multicultural backgrounds struggling with a variety of mental and physical health concerns. Dr. Mauren has a clinical specialty in perinatal mood and anxiety disorders and is the clinical lead for Park Nicollet's Women's Reproductive Mental Health Program which maintains a focus on perinatal and reproductive mental health.
