**Participants will be able to:**

1. Describe basic principles of risk management, as applied to several specific clinical situations that frequently arise in professional practice.
2. Identify core heuristics and biasing processes that can interfere with appropriate risk management and ethical decision-making.
3. List three strategies to ameliorate decision-making challenges.

4. Describe preliminary considerations prior to engaging in interjurisdictional practice.
5. Evaluate potential issues and preventive responses to supervisory risks.
6. Identify three methods for reducing privacy risks when using technology in clinical practice and responding appropriately to breaches if they occur.
7. Name three strategies for handling subpoenas and deposition demands.

### About the Presenters:

**Daniel O. Taube, J.D., Ph.D.**, earned his J.D. from Villanova University in 1985 and his Ph.D. in clinical psychology from Hahnemann University in 1987, as a member of the Hahnemann/ Villanova Joint Psychology and Law Graduate Program. He is a Full Professor at the California School of Professional Psychology, San Francisco at Alliant International University, past Psy.D. Program Director, founder and coordinator of the Forensic Family Child Track and member of the Child/Family Track. His areas of professional focus include ethical and legal issues in professional practice, child protection, addictions, and disability and parenting. In addition to his teaching and research interests, he has been in private practice for 23 years, has served on the APA Ethics Appeals Panel for the past 20 years, and taught graduate and professional level courses on ethical and legal issues in professional practice for 25 years. Dr. Taube regularly consults with a wide range of practitioners and community agencies regarding standards of practice and ethical concerns. *Dr. Taube is a paid consultant for The Trust.*
